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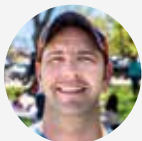

Now for the elections that have more than one candidate:

Centennial District 1 (SouthGlenn)

Fernando Branch <https://branchforcentennial.com> is the left of center candidate while Robyn Carnes <https://www.carnesforcentennial.com> is the right of center candidate. Both candidates have compelling back stories. Fernando grew up legitimately poor in the south and has risen from poverty to become a successful public-school teacher and community leader. BALLOT MEASURES:

Amendment 78: This amendment is a reaction to Governor Polis being able to spend the Covid money from the Federal Government any way he saw fit without

consulting the legislature. A yes vote will require legislative approval before the Governor spends any "custodial money".

Proposition 119: Raise taxes on marijuana to create a fund for "out of school learning opportunities".

Proposition 120: Reduce property tax rates from 7.15% to 6.5% for residential and for other properties (with some exceptions) from 29% to 26.4%.

Arapahoe County Ballot Issue 1A: The current Arapahoe County Open Space, Trails and Parks sales tax of .25% is set to expire. Arapahoe County would like to make the tax permanent. A yes vote makes the tax permanent.

Who doesn't like a cookie every now and then? Cookies have a long history, but the first ones didn't taste much like the treats we enjoy today.

According to some sources, the first cookies were made in Rome around the third century B.C. They were thin, hard, bland wafers that were twice baked, and the Romans ate them by dipping them in wine. Modern cookies may have originated in Persia during the seventh century, when sugar became more common in that region. They became popular across Europe in the 14th century, enjoyed by royalty and peasants alike. One reason for their appeal was that they traveled well in tins and boxes, making them a reliable source of food on trips.

The word "cookie" comes from the Dutch "koekje," for "little cake." Cookies arrived in America in the 17th century, in the form of macaroons, gingerbread cookies, and the "jumble," a hard cookie that combined nuts, sweeteners, and water. The cookies we're most familiar with, made by creaming butter and sugar, became common in the 18th century.

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
